

Bray Tidy Towns to hold art competition

BRAY Tidy Towns is inviting young people to take part in its schools and youth art competition for recycled goods.

The aim is to inspire a generation of students with a passion for the environment and to help them become aware of how much people throw out every day that can be turned into beautiful and useful objects.

The organisation hope to arm them with experience and knowledge in waste reduction, resource recovery, and leadership in the environmental field.

Entrants can make art from anything including plastic bottles, bottle tops, cans, CDs, old clothes or fabric and any other trash they can find.

Art pieces can take the form of wall art, sculpture and design pieces such as mirror frames, trays, tables, fashion and more. All primary and post primary schools as well as youth clubs in Bray are invited to take part. There will be three categories - primary, and junior and senior post-primary.

The prize will be a trophy and entry into the national Tidy Towns Schools and Youth Awards.

Submissions should be comprised completely of recycled or reused materials.

The closing date for entries is Friday, May 14. Winners will be announced on May 28.
